DESCRIPTION

The Annual Philadelphia Trans Wellness Conference (PTWC) will be held **August 2-4, 2018** at the Pennsylvania Convention Center (Philadelphia, PA, USA) (<http://www.trans-health.org/>). The World Professional Association for Transgender Health's Student Initiative (WSI) is collaborating with PTWC to organize the fifth graduate student research symposium as part of conference programming. The symposium will showcase research in transgender health by graduate students, recently graduated students who wish to present research completed during their program, post-docs, and other research trainees to share and disseminate the latest emerging science within the trans community. We invite student researchers to submit an abstract to be considered part of this session.

- Abstracts (poster or oral) should be 250 words maximum and structured (Background, Methods, Results & Conclusion [if data collection phase is complete]).
- Deadline to be considered for the symposium: **Friday, April 13, 2018.**
